Tour	Santo Domingo City Tour The Colonial City of Santo Domingo, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a city built along the Rio Ozama with sixteenth-century buildings and crisscrossed by cobblestone streets. The Colonial City of Santo Domingo holds over 500 years of history. During our guided walking tour, guests can see the city in a fresh way where stories come to life, a journey that mixes history with the stories of those who once lived there.	9-10:30am
